# INTRODUCTION

## Who?

### ❑ Student population

- 3 million students in France
- + 20% in the last 10 years



## What?

### ❑ Sexist and Sexual violence

- Unwanted behaviors, remarks, or actions based on gender or sexuality.



**Significant public health problem**



**60% of students in France: Victims or witnesses**

*(Baromètre, 2023)*

### Objective:

- **Assess** prevalence
- **Identify** risk factors
- **Evaluate** impact on mental health

# METHODS (1/2)

## Survey:

- Cross-sectional study (Feb–May 2022)
- **3 Universities in Normandy**
- Self-administered online questionnaire:
  - **Sexual violence:** cyberbullying, sexual assault, rape.
  - **Health impact:** Mental disorders, Suicide attempts, Eating disorders, Substance use
  - **Sociodemographic data:** Gender, Age, student job.

## Inclusion Criteria:

- Volunteers
- Enrolled in a university
- Undergraduate students (1st, 2nd, or 3rd year)



# METHODS (2/2)

## Statistical analysis:

- Logistic regression models: univariable and multivariable
  - Identify risk factors
  - Assess the impact of victimization on mental health

## Weighting process:

- Ensure that survey data represent the population
- Based on: **gender, grade, university affiliation, and age group.**
- To minimize selection biases

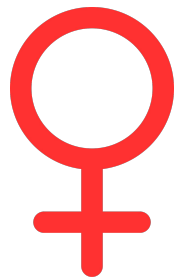

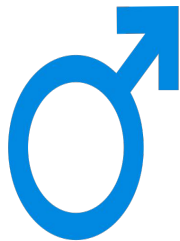
## Demographic characteristics

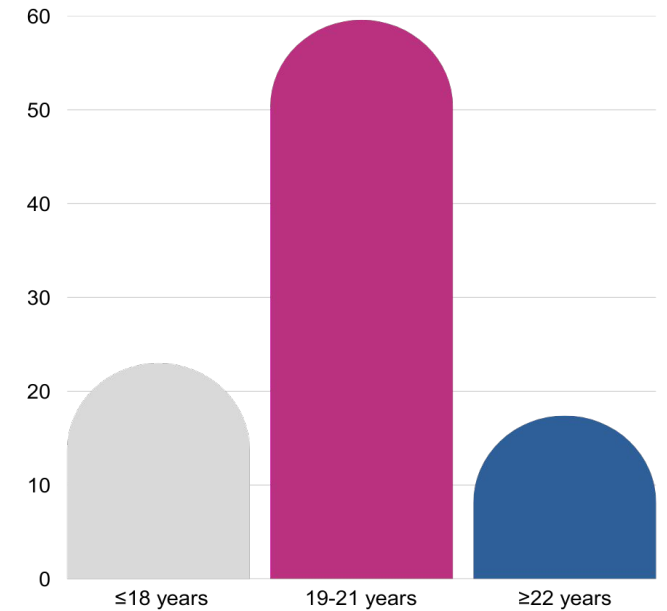

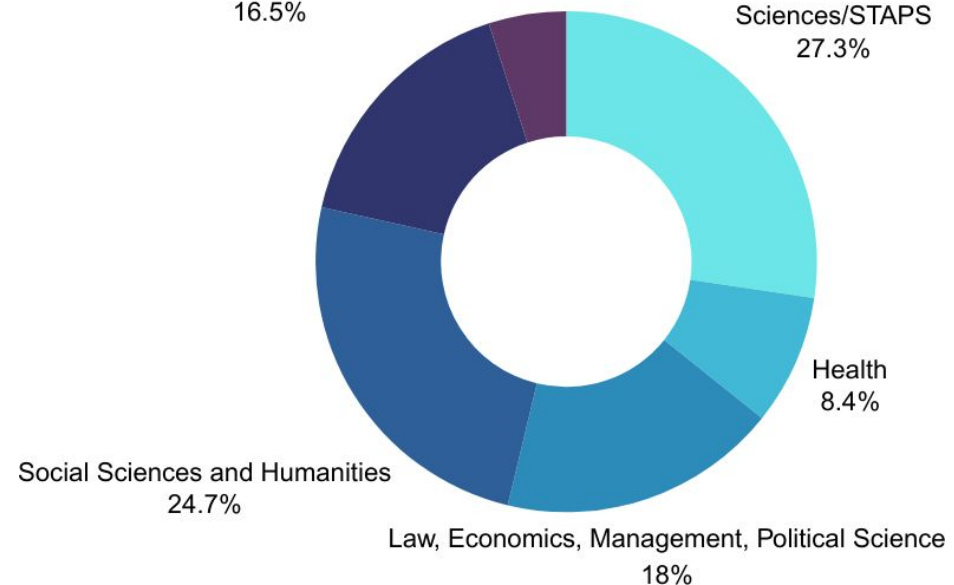

Participant Age Groups (%)



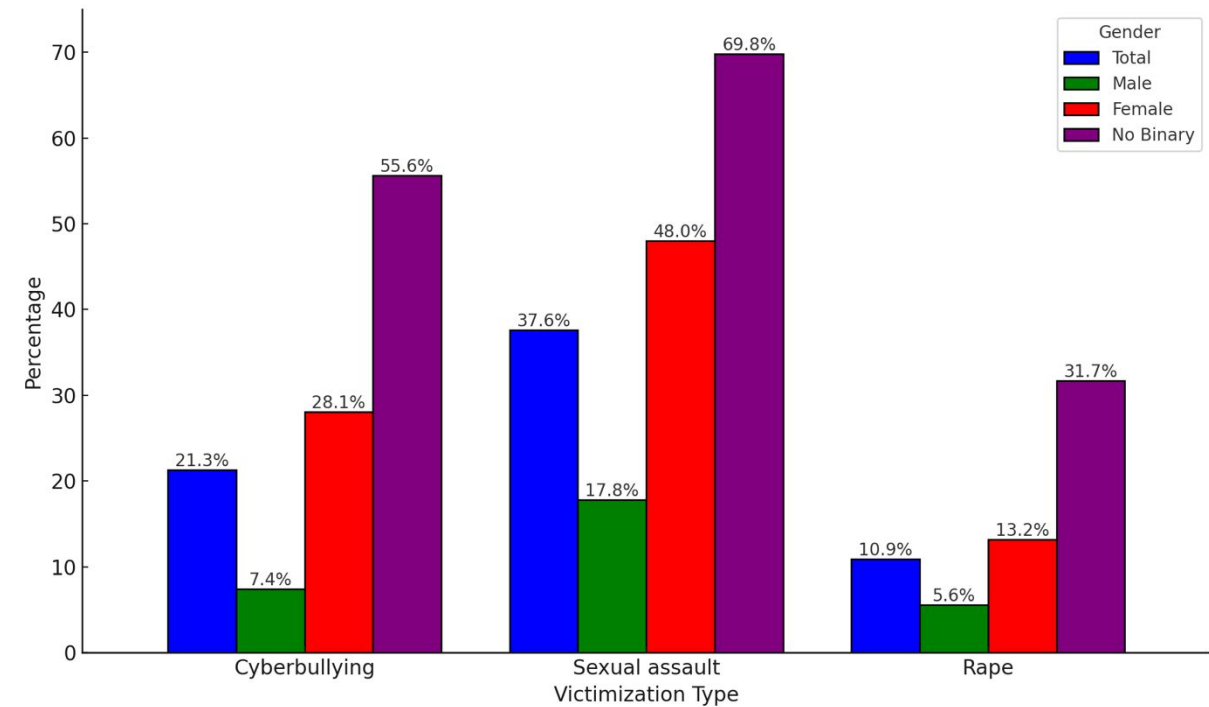
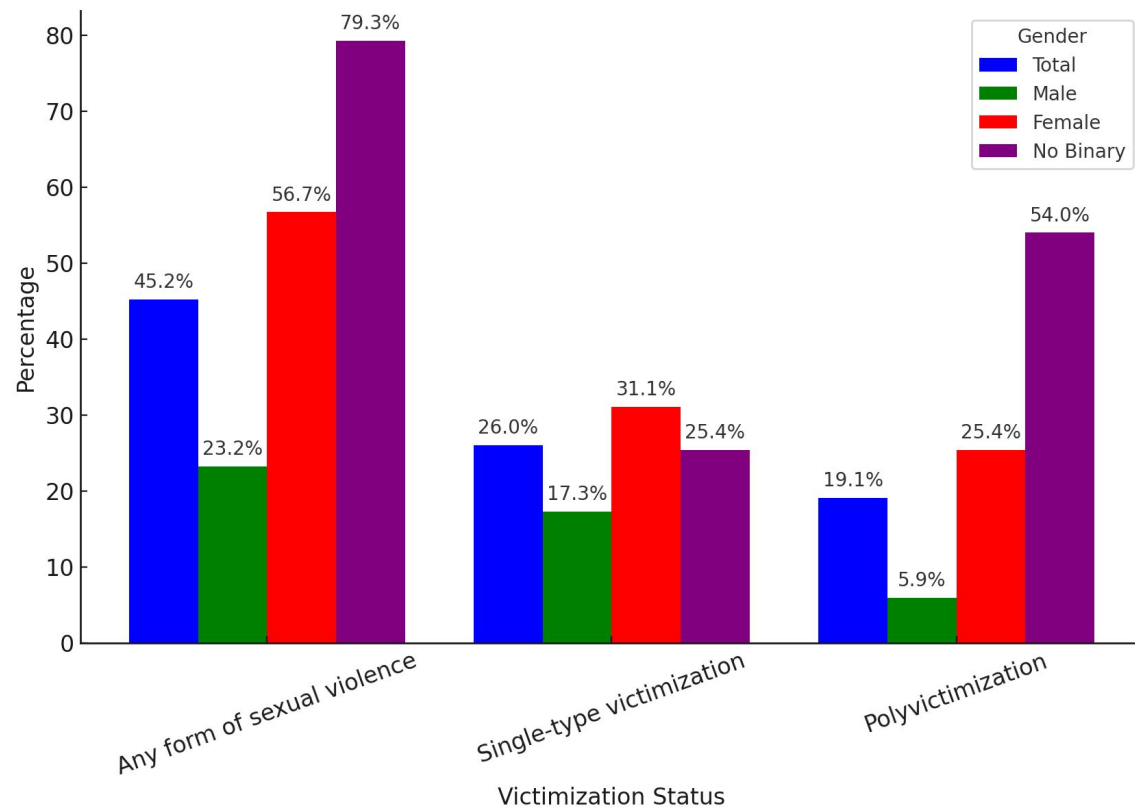

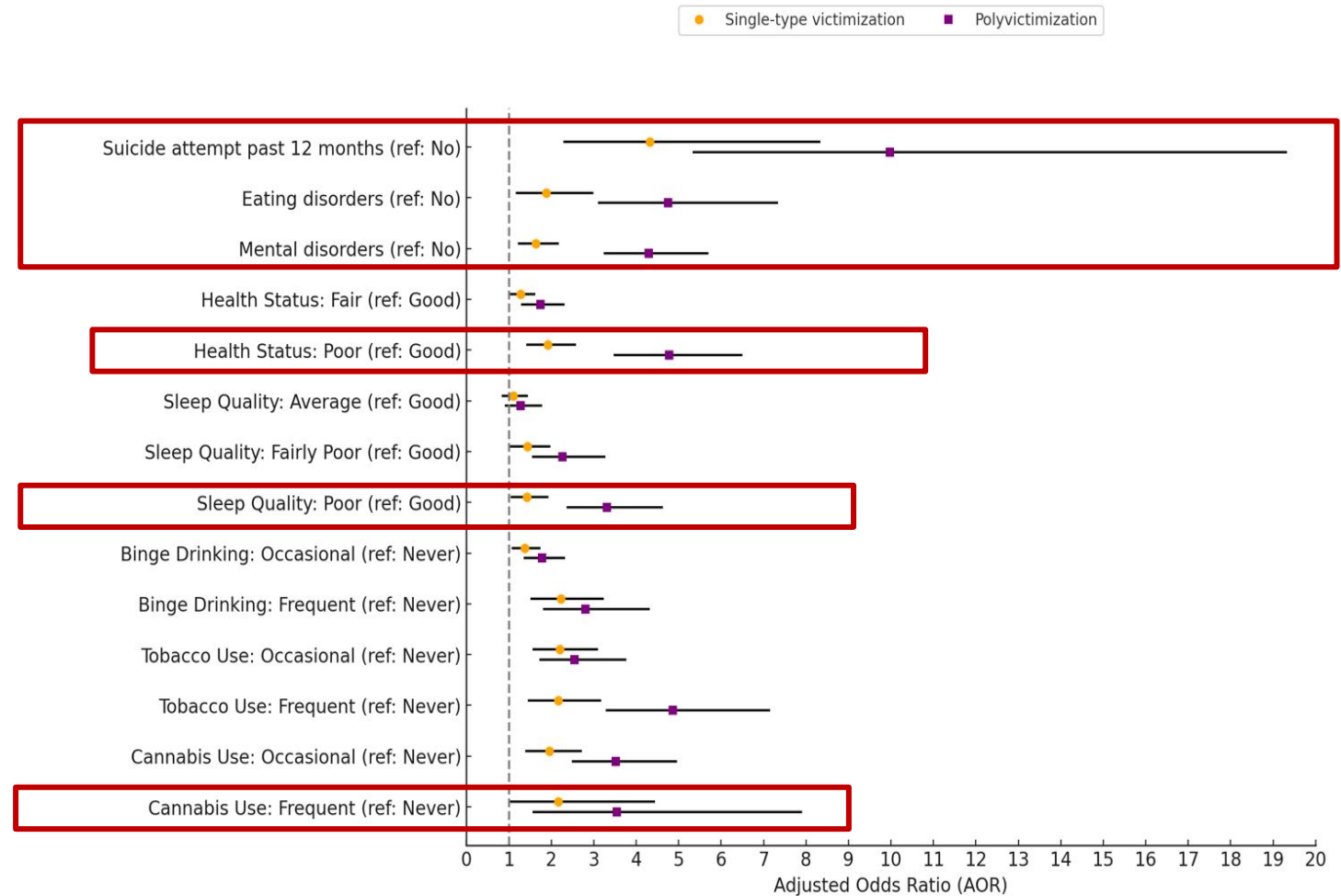
## ◆ Factors Associated with Victimization

# Discussion/ Conclusion



## Findings

- **High prevalence** of sexual violence among university students. *(Howard et al., 2019)*
- **Severe health consequences** for victims: Mental disorders, Suicide attempts, Eating disorders.



## Call to Action & Future Research

- **Universities** : Implement **comprehensive prevention programs** and **enforce safety policies** to foster a secure learning environment.
- **Primary care providers**: Identify and support victims
- **Awareness & training** for healthcare providers are **essential** in mitigating the **negative health impacts** of sexual violence on students.
- **Longitudinal studies**: Assess the **long-term impact** and **effectiveness** of interventions.
